




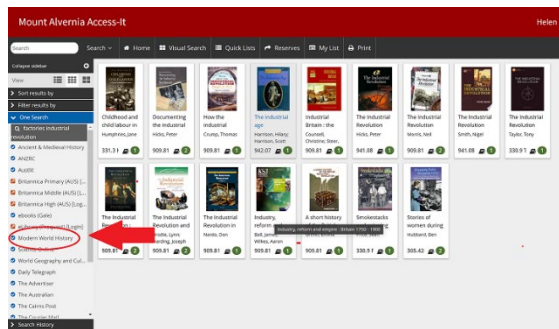


Inventions and Innovators the Industrial Revolution Research Guide

Use the iCentre Website to access the following **reliable** sources of information.

<p>List Key Words</p> 	<p>Industrial Revolution Inventions *name of invention Inventors *name of inventor</p>
<p>Go to the OPAC: Do a search for industrial revolution inventions and innovations</p>	
<p>OPAC</p>  	<p>Check the contents and index pages of these books to locate the relevant information.</p> <p>Take notes/photocopy relevant pages for highlighting and notetaking.</p> <p>Don't forget to record the information required for referencing.</p>
<p>Go to One Search for academic articles</p>	
<p>Britannica Middle</p>  	<p>Scroll through sub-headings to relevant section – skim read to check usefulness.</p> <p>Save article for notetaking by choosing 'print' and 'save as PDF'.</p> <p>Don't forget to record the information required for referencing.</p>

Articles

Open articles – scroll and skim read for relevance and usefulness. Tip: use Ctrl F or Command F to discover if your key terms appear in the article.

Save article by choosing ‘download’ and save the PDF.

Scroll through the transcripts to check for usefulness and relevance.

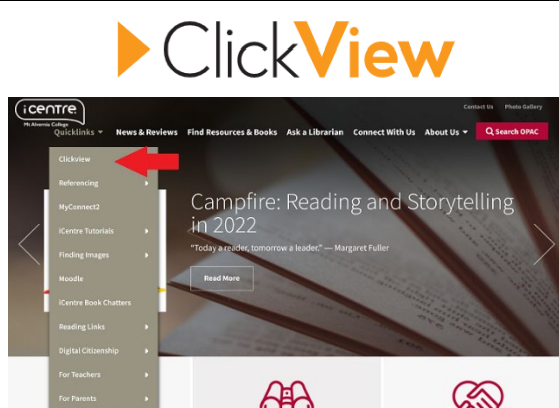

Scan headings and description for relevance and usefulness.

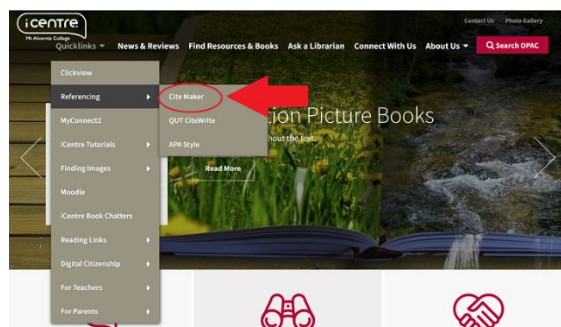
