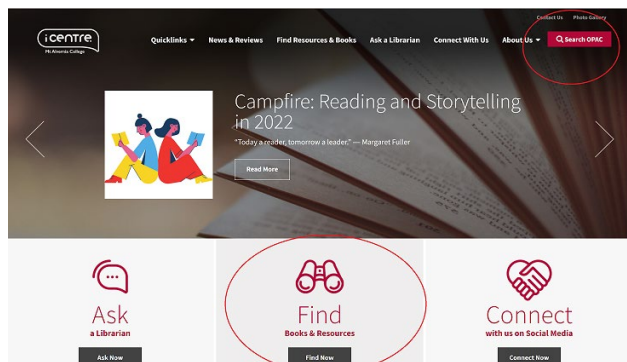

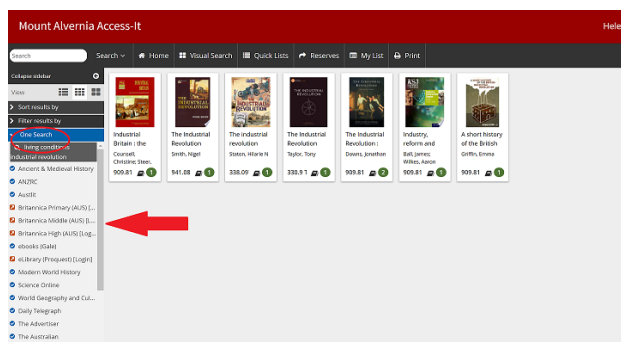
Check the **contents** and **index** pages of these books to locate the relevant information.

Britannica Middle

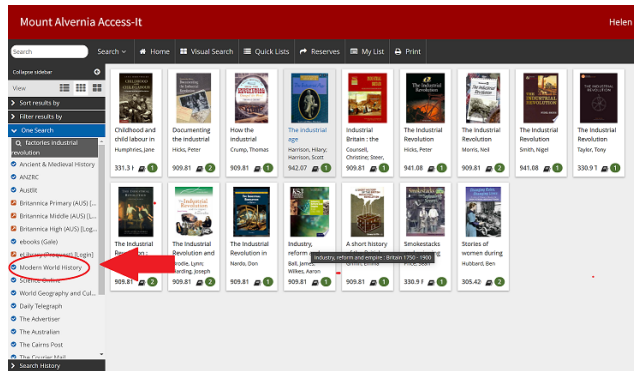


Scroll through **sub-headings** to relevant section – skim read to check **usefulness**.

Save article for notetaking by choosing 'print' and 'save as PDF'.

Don't forget to record the information required for **referencing**.

Articles

Open articles – scroll and skim read for relevance and usefulness. Tip: use Ctrl F or Command F to discover if your key terms appear in the article.

Save article by choosing ‘download’ and save the PDF.

Primary sources

Scroll through the transcripts to check for usefulness and relevance.

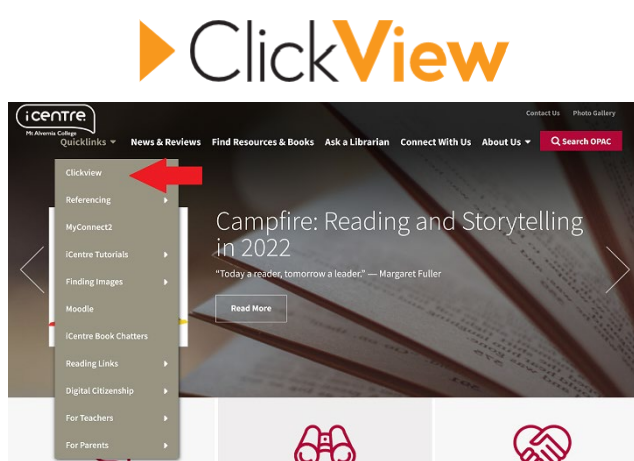

Search for Industrial Revolution

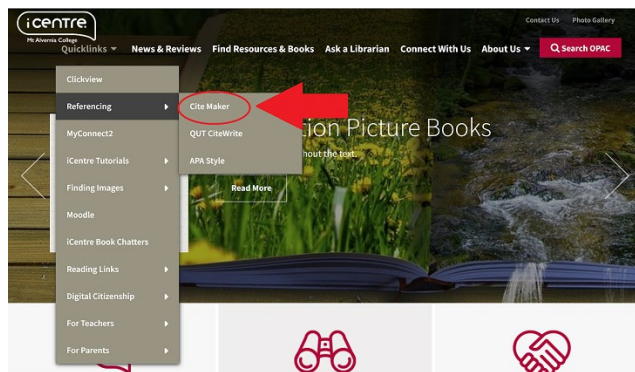
Scan headings and description for relevance and usefulness.
